#### Mission Summit 2013 Update

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Luke 4:18-19 NIV).

Mission Summit 2013, held this past June in Overland Park, Kansas, was an incredible gathering of American Baptist believers from all over the United States! Along with some other FBC Omaha folks, Lisa, our boys, and I had the unique opportunity to represent our local church and to be a part of this historic occasion.

It was an amazing time of celebrating who we are as American Baptists: A time to celebrate many milestones in our history. First, we celebrated the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation, which is significant because of the involvement of many American Baptists in the anti-slavery movement back in the 1800s. Second, we celebrated the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ministry of Adoniram and Ann Judson in Burma. As you may already know, our own American Karen Baptist Church can trace their roots directly back to the Judsons' ministry. Third, we celebrated the 375<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the First Baptist Church in America, located in Providence Rhode Island. *American Baptists have been active leaders in the work of mission and justice in American and beyond for a long time; and God is calling us at FBC Omaha to continue that legacy into the future.* 

The Summit included three days of workshops and challenging messages. And I walked away from the experience with three things that I believe relate clearly to what God is calling us to do at FBC Omaha.

- Justice The first day of the summit included a focus on justice and the issue of unprecedented levels of incarceration in jails and prisons in our country. It challenged me to think about our church and our partnership with the "Good News" jail ministry in Omaha, and how important that is as we seek to bring the good news of the gospel to those who are incarcerated now. It challenged me also to consider the value of effective youth ministry in helping to address the issue by providing a healthy alternative for young people and a positive influence in our neighborhood.
- **Cross-Cultural Local Mission** The second day of the summit focused on cross-cultural mission, as exemplified by the Judsons. It reminded me that we at FBC Omaha should feel incredibly blessed and humbled that God has entrusted us with hosting a Karen-speaking congregation. It challenged me that we ought to renew our ministry commitment to them. And it also challenged me with the idea of establishing other cross-cultural missions within our community, as the Lord will lead.
- **Preparing for the Future** The third day focused on following the Spirit's leading as we seek to reach a generation that is increasingly non-Christian and unaware of the Gospel. For me, this was particularly significant as I reflected on the transitions taking place in Midtown Omaha. As new housing developments emerge, as new and different people move in, will we be ready to reach them? Are we prepared for the future?

And of course, I related it all to our annual theme, "GOSPEL: GOD'S WORD FOR EVERYONE." I believe that we *must* remain committed to that idea. We *must* remain committed to the holistic reality of the gospel: That it involves "preaching the good news," of course; but that it also means "recovery of sight for the blind," and help for the "oppressed" (Luke 4:18). We *must* remain committed to reaching *all* the people God brings into our lives, whether they are refugees from another country who speak another language, or whether they are young adults from next door who are so different from us culturally that they *might as well* speak another language. THE GOSPEL IS GOD'S WORD FOR EVERYONE. Let us *always* keep that in mind!
