Matt's Musings...

...for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? (Romans 10:13-14 NIV)

There can be no clearer summons to get involved in the mission work of Christ than these words from the book of Romans. We live in a world that in many ways is still as broken as it was when these words were first written two millennia ago: A world in which poverty and hopelessness plague the hearts of our cities; a world in which many children grow up without knowing the love of good parents; a world in which young people can enter adulthood without having ever heard who Jesus is. This world is just as desperately in need of the salvation that only Jesus Christ can provide as it was during the days of the Apostles.

And for us as Christians, there is really only one option. You see, we do not have the luxury of sitting on our backsides and just getting depressed about the brokenness of our world. Absolutely not! Why? Because the fact that "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved," motivates us to do something! It motivates us to proclaim the gospel to our broken world through words and action, so that the world may hear, and so that by hearing they might believe, and so that by believing they might call on the name of the Lord and "be saved." That is the very heartbeat of our mission.

In late 2013 an estimated 40,000 people traveled to Rangoon, Burma (Yangon, Myanmar) to a conference planned for 10,000. Every school, church and many offices within miles was cleared of furniture so people could sleep on the floors. Fire pits were dug to hold massive metal trays with rice to feed everyone. The government gave permission to ethnic Christians from remote parts of Burma to attend this special occasion. Many international guests were also present. What had they gathered for?

This extraordinary event was to celebrate the 200th anniversary of the coming of Ann and Adoniram Judson to Burma. The Christians in Burma see this as the coming of the good news of Jesus Christ to their land. We in the U.S. see it as the beginning of the modern Protestant missionary movement.

With so many people groups, languages, and traditions represented in the celebration it was truly a taste of heaven. See Revelation 5:9-10: "by your blood you ransomed for God saints from every tribe and language and people and nation..." Let us pray that the freedom allowed for this event by the government will continue for these faithful believers.


