Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled.

He will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him, spit on him, flog him and kill him. On the third day he will rise again."

(Luke 18:31-33 NIV)

At First Baptist Church Omaha, we ended the month of March by looking at the end of the eighteenth chapter of Luke's gospel. In this passage, Jesus takes his disciples aside to reveal to them some very important information. I can imagine he might have put his hand on their shoulders, and looked them straight in the eye, to *really* get their attention. And likewise, as we enter this new month of April, and the prospect of Holy Week, I believe the Lord also want to really get *our* attention

And the information Jesus had for the disciples was really nothing new. He had shared it with them already many times ever since he had "set his face to go to Jerusalem" (Luke 9:51 KJV). So it was really more of a reminder—a very serious reminder of the core and ultimate purpose of his mission on earth.

And as we think about the month of April here at FBCO, it is interesting to point out that, in this passage, Jesus told his disciples about three very key events that were about to take place.

First, he told them "We are going up to Jerusalem." This is an event known later on in the gospel narrative as "The Triumphal Entry" (see Luke 19:28-44). The children of FBCO and American Karen Baptist Church will help us celebrate this day as they lead us in song on Palm Sunday, April 13th.

Second, Jesus told the disciples that he would "be handed over to the Gentiles [who would] mock him, insult him, spit on him, flog him and kill him." This somber reality is an event we must commemorate as people who follow Christ, for the cross is at the very heart of our faith and who we are as believers. As such, we will gather on Good Friday, April 18th, to do just that: Worshipping the Lord with songs of the cross, sharing communion at the Lord's Table, and reliving what happened that day by reading the Scripture together.

Third, Jesus told them that "On the third day he will rise again." For us as Christians, there can be no more significant event than the fact that our Lord, Jesus Christ, rose from the grave! And so, Resurrection Sunday on April 20th will be a day of great joy and very appropriate celebration. To help us do just that, we will start the morning with our first annual Easter Sunday Potluck Brunch at 9:30am. Then, there will be a fun-filled Easter Egg Hunt for kids on the third floor of the building at 10:30am. And to cap it all off, we will join together is a joyful celebration, praising the risen Savior in song and proclamation of the Gospel, and also rejoicing with several individuals who have decided to follow the Lord in baptism.

These events that we will commemorate and celebrate shall serve as the cornerstone of our worship together this month. It is my hope that as we reflect on these and other events that took place during Holy Week, we would in a way insert ourselves in the story, growing in our understanding of the Lord's sacrifice, his love for us, and the significance of his suffering, death, resurrection, and victory for our personal lives and our mission together as God's people.


INVESTMENT IN THE KINGDOM1

International Mission Focus: Ignite Bolivia 2014

What is Ignite?

Ignite is an exciting program, sponsored by American Baptist International Ministries (IM), that enables young adults to spark a connection, kindle spiritual and personal growth, and blaze with passion for Jesus Christ. It is an adventure of cross-cultural mission service that will push them out of their comfort zones into an extraordinary faith walk with God. During their

travels, team members deepen their relationship with God while seeking a deeper understanding of international missions. Each year, Ignite takes an adventurous group of young adults to a different part of the globe where International Ministries is engaged in missions work. This year, they will be heading to Bolivia. The 2014 Ignite team has already formed and will include members both from the United States and Chile.

At First Baptist Church Omaha, we have two unique connections to Ignite:

First of all, Lisa Toupin is an alumni of the "Xtreme Team" (this is the previous name of Ignite). Lisa was a part of a team that traveled all over the nation of India, engaging in missions work in many different contexts, everything from small tribal villages to the mega-cities of Calcutta and Hyderabad. It was a life-changing experience for Lisa and all of her fellow team members.

Secondly, Pastor Matt has been called to serve as one of the leaders of Ignite this summer. IM has issued this call because of his experience in Bolivia last fall developing relationships with local mission partners and because there was a need for a leader who speaks both English and Spanish, given the bilingual make-up of the team. Recently, the FBCO Cabinet unanimously endorsed Pastor Matt's call to represent our church and to serve in this endeavor.

Pastor Matt will be partnering with IM missionary in Bolivia, Mario Morales, along with other IM staff, to lead the team. He will be in Bolivia July 7th-20th. After that, he will accompany the team to the World Mission Conference in Green Lake, Wisconsin, July 21st-25th.

This is a unique mission opportunity not only for Pastor Matt, but for our entire church family as well. How can you get involved? First, let's begin praying NOW for a transformative and safe experience for the Ignite team. Secondly, let's use this experience as an opportunity to consider how we at FBCO might get more actively involved in missions internationally as we seek to be "Living the Gospel in Midtown and Beyond," to use the words of our new vision statement. Third, consider attending the World Mission Conference in July to celebrate what God is doing through missionary work in Bolivia and elsewhere throughout the globe.
