Matt's Musings...

And when He had taken some bread and given thanks, He broke it and gave it to them, saying, "This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me."

And in the same way He took the cup after they had eaten, saying, "This cup which is poured out for you is the new covenant in My blood."

(Luke 22:19-20 NASB)

Last month in this article, I couldn't help but write about the importance of our identity as Baptist believers when it comes to the two "ordinances" of the local church: Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

September 21st, 2014 was an historic day to celebrate both of these ordinances in fellowship with our local mission partners at American Karen Baptist Church. I was so proud of my son, Levi, who took the big step of *believer's* baptism! He was joined by our own Sandy Richeson and seven other brothers and sisters in Christ from AKBC. The service was concluded with a historic time of communion at the Lord's Table. This time of communion at a Baptism service was new to us at FBCO, but it was part of a deeply-rooted tradition for our Karen friends. Really, there is no more appropriate way to celebrate baptism and new life in Christ than to join with new believers as they come to the Lord's Table for the first time.

What an amazing celebration and testimony to the mighty work of the Holy Spirit that is taking place at the corner of Park and Harney. (By the way, to see some AWESOME pictures of the baptism service and church picnic celebration, just flip back a couple pages in this newsletter!)

Now that it is October, we are continuing our focus on the two ordinances of the church, but calling special attention to the Lord's Table. The Spanish word for table is *mesa*. No surprise then, that our new outreach ministry to young adults *and* Spanish-speaking people here in midtown takes that same name: *MESA*.

MESA is founded on two basic ideas: That the work of ministry should begin at the Lord's Table (*la Mesa del Señor*) and that it should be cross-cultural. We see that the work of ministry begins at the Lord's Table in the gospel accounts when Jesus shared his final meal before he went to the cross with his disciples in the upper room. Not long after this episode, we see the cross-cultural aspect of ministry early on in the history of the church in Acts 2, where

these same disciples shared the good news with people from many different nations and language groups.

The vision of MESA is "Culture Reconciled." The good news is that God desires to see people reconciled to himself and to one another. That is why MESA envisions a world in which people from various cultures are reconciled to God and to people from different cultures based on what Jesus Christ has done for them all on the cross.

And that is why, starting October 5th, we will begin studying Luke 22:1-23, that key passage in which the Lord relates to us the whole point of the *mesa*. It will be a time for us all, whether we are a part of the MESA program or not, to be *revived in our passion for Jesus*, and to be reminded of the significance of the cross. - 4. **31 days of appreciation:** You know how when November rolls around and everyone uses each day to say what they are thankful for on facebook? Well try using the 31 days of October to send encouraging and kind words to your pastor on facebook, letters, cards, emails etc.
- 5. **Goodie Bags:** What are your staff members favorite things? Reese's Pieces, baseball, sunglasses, cookies...oh wait those are my favorite things! Anyway, build a nice goodie bag with their favorite candies or tickets to a movie.
- 6. **Be Simple.** Sometimes it's just the little things like a kind word, a hug, or simple "Thanks!" means more than anything.
- 7. **Be Extravagant!** Every once in a while I hear stories of churches who for major anniversaries (10, 15, 20 year type things) do something big like a trip to Europe or a cruise or a new car for a staff member. Maybe that's too much but how about a 3 day weekend someplace close? A yard makeover or clean up? Detail their car?

The Youth and Young Adults will be in charge of clean-up following the meal.







Thanks for supporting our youth and continue to pray for them as they navigate the treacherous landscape of junior high/high school. Blessings!


